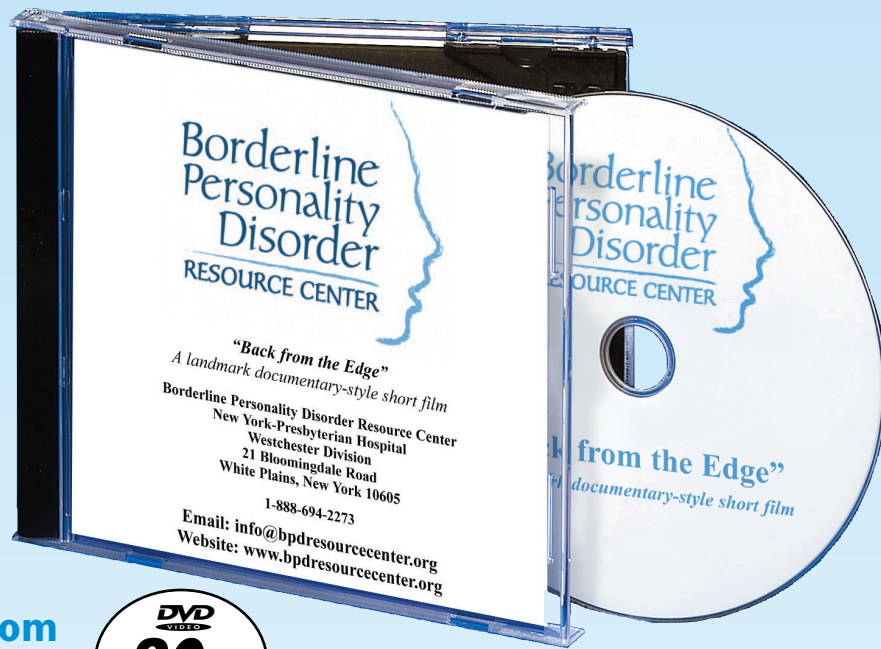

BPD is actually about two to three times more prevalent than bipolar disorder or schizophrenia, yet many people have never heard of it. Roughly 10 million Americans -- 75% of which are women -- or 2% of the general population suffer from BPD, a disorder characterized by symptoms of impulsivity, extreme mood swings, fear of abandonment, stormy relationships, self-injuring acts, unstable self-image and intense anger. BPD often occurs in conjunction with other disorders, including depression, substance abuse, eating disorders, anxiety disorders, bipolar disorder or other personality disorders.

The BPD Resource Center is a national non-profit affiliated with New York-Presbyterian Hospital. The Center offers the most comprehensive and current information on BPD, including treatment techniques, and maintains a database of professionals and facilities across the country that treat the disorder.
